Signs of Recovery Across the NDT Industry

I am pleased to present the results of PQNDT's 2010 NDT Salary & Benefits Survey. Once again we have produced a profile of the "typical" NDT professional in a variety of industries, levels of certification and geographic areas. While no single individual fits this profile exactly, our survey results do create a picture of what an average person might expect to earn in wages and benefits in the NDT industry.

We collected responses for this survey during the third and fourth quarters of 2010. Therefore, they reflect the state of the NDT industry at that time, and may not be indicative of present conditions. Keep in mind that the results published here are a representative sample of the industry.

Layoffs and Job Searches

One new area of our survey was directly related to the sagging economy. We asked several questions about layoffs. Here are the results:

What will 2011 bring?

We are already seeing encouraging signs across the NDT industry in 2011. Contract workers led the way, with a big increase in the number and length of contracts occurring during the first quarter as companies started to ramp up production again. This has been followed by a similar increase in the number of permanent NDT job openings during the second quarter, as managers gain more confidence in the strength of the recovery.

As a result, the NDT job market is tightening. Many of those who retired or were laid off during the recession have left the industry permanently, so the "talent pool" is not as deep as it was a few years ago. NDT professionals can once more afford to be more selective when it comes to where they work.
